## [Get around Denmark on a budget \[1\]](#)

Getting around Denmark does not have to be expensive. If you walk or cycle you can do it for free, but there are also other options available.

### **Travel for free**

If you walk or bicycle, you can eliminate transport costs entirely, and Denmark is well-suited for both ramblers and cyclists. Denmark has a comprehensive network of walking and cycling routes that offer both a safe and easy way to get around. The relative distances in Denmark mean that you're never far away from the next supermarket or lodgings. If you are to cross the [Great Belt \("Storebælt"\)](#) [2] or the [Øresund Bridge](#) [3] you will need to buy a bus or train ticket, as you're not allowed to use those bridges on foot or by bicycle.

### **City bikes in Denmark**

Free-to-use city bikes are currently being offered in [Frederikshavn](#) [4], [Aalborg](#) [5], [Aarhus](#) [6] and other cities. The [Copenhagen city bike](#) [7] is a great way to see Denmark's capital city but it costs 25kr per hour.

### **Cheap train travel in Denmark**

You can save a lot of money when travelling by train in Denmark. Especially when crossing the Great Belt, which entitle you to buy so-called "Orange billetter" on selected departures. There are other forms of discounted tickets available, including the senior tickets with up to 50% off and tickets for young people. Kids under 12 years old travel for free with an adult.
